School Funding Crisis

Yesterday you hopefully received a letter regarding the school funding crisis. This crisis looms ever present over all schools in the country including Alfriston. This is why a campaign has been launched and we need the help and support of parents. Our budget share has not increased since 2012 and yet costs are increasing on rates, resources, services, salaries and pensions for staff and there has also been the introduction of the apprenticeship levy. To date all East Sussex schools have worked hard to shield parents and children from the impending crisis, often cutting back on 'unseen' costs with longer term implications but we have now reached 'tipping point'.

We urge you to write to your MP to join us in highlighting the urgent need to reduce rising costs for schools. We believe we must now all work together, as schools, parents and governors are doing across the country, in order to protect the education, wellbeing and future of our children.

Procedure for Early Morning

We would like to remind parents/carers about the start of day procedure - **until the bell goes at 8.42am all children must be supervised by a parent/carer.** We appreciate there may be occasions when you're unable to wait with your child, in this instance you are more than welcome to arrange for another parent/carer to supervise your child on your behalf.

Children should arrive at school by 8.42am ready for the bell. Being on time is vital, arriving late at school can be very disruptive for the late child, the teacher and other children in the class.

Message From Mrs Ottaway - Science Day Poster Competition Reminder

We will be having a Science Day next Thursday, 16th March, to celebrate British Science Week. Children will be engaging in science themed activities in classes and sharing their results with each other and parents in an assembly at 2.30pm on this day. We have also launched a school competition to further engage children in science! For the competition we would like you to investigate or imagine the different types of changes occurring in science or the natural world around you. Choose a topic for your poster and do some research around the idea. For example:

What different types of change can we examine in nature?

Carry out a science experiment and investigate the changes.

How has our world changed over the years?

Think about how you might change the world in the future.

Once you have done your research, it's time to get creative! Your poster must be 2D and on either A4 or A3 paper as they will be going on display. You can use pencils, paint, pens, pop up pictures, pull out tabs...

Posters will be judged on how creative and well-researched the ideas are and how well the poster has been made or drawn. Once the poster is complete, write your name, class and house team on the back and hand it to your class teacher by Wednesday 15th March. Mrs Ottaway has explained more about this to the children in assembly.
