Uniform

We would like to remind you that all children must wear socks or tights and that this also applies if they are wearing sandals. These should be white, black, red or grey ankle or knee length socks or tights (no trainer socks).

Leaving

Brian, our caretaker, is retiring at the end of this school year having worked at the school for many years. He will be greatly missed by everyone; his DIY and maintenance skills are amazing and he has been key in keeping the pool up and running. If you would like to contribute towards Brian's leaving gift this can be handed in to the school office.

Swimming

A number of children have this week forgotten all or part of their swimming kit. Swimming is part of the National Curriculum and for May to July will be one of the PE lessons we teach each week for all classes. It is therefore compulsory for children to take part in the lessons, so they should ensure they have their kit in school. As well as their swimming costume and towel they must have a swimming hat. If your child/children wear earrings, please can you ensure these aren't worn on their swimming day as earrings should not be worn in the pool.

Sun Safety

This morning the school health team came to visit us and gave the whole school an assembly on sun safety which reinforces our sun protection strategy. The children were told about the five S's: **Slip** on a T-shirt **Slop** on suncream **Slap** on a hat Wear **sunglasses** Find **shade** And drink water.

'Beat the Street'

This free programme has now arrived in East Sussex; it started yesterday and continues until 26th July 2017. The project is funded by ESCC Public Health, NHS Hastings and Rother CCG and NHS Eastbourne, Hailsham and Seaford CCG, forming part of their comprehensive programme of activity to improve health. 'Beat the Street' is designed to get kids and communities moving by inspiring people to make small changes, such as walking or cycling to school every day, to improve their health. The idea of 'Beat the Street' is that 'Beat Boxes' have been placed on lamp posts throughout East Sussex and players tap on the 'Beat Boxes' with their key fob or card as they walk, cycle, or scoot around town, earning points for themselves and their team. Players can view their progress online. There will be prizes for winning schools and teams, whilst there will also be plenty of lucky tap prizes, which could be won by any player taking part in the project. All the children were sent home yesterday with a key fob, a map showing where the 'Beat Boxes' are located, and a letter to parents/carers explaining the idea of the game. We look forward to seeing lots of the children taking part in this activity as it appears to be great fun.

Berwick Church Visit

In the final week of last term the whole school took part in a visit to Berwick Church. We heard from Reverend Peter Blee over the holidays and would like to share some of his comments with you:

I would like to tell the school how much I enjoyed your visit and to say how well behaved everyone was. The children were all delightful; I enjoyed meeting them and seeing their work. The relaxed atmosphere at the church with that number of children is a great reflection on the staff and helpers. I was happy to have everyone. There is a little display in the church with the children's shells to mark your visit. I thought you might like to know that when I came out of church on Sunday morning two swifts flew around the spire and later chased each other over our garden screeching loudly.

Musical Cabaret Evening

To celebrate the end of another year of brilliant music here at Alfriston, Sue Whitehead is organising a musical cabaret evening on Wednesday 14th June at 6pm in the school hall. All of the children who Sue teaches will be taking part as well as the trumpet group, violins and the choir. The concert is expected to last approximately an hour and a half. It will be a relaxed evening with chairs dotted around tables and the audience will have the opportunity to listen to the performances while enjoying wine, fruit juice and cheese sharing platters. Everyone is welcome to attend the evening and support and enjoy our young performers. If you would like to attend, tickets cost £1 per person and are available from the school office. If you would like to pre-order a cheese sharing platter (a chunk of Cheddar cheese, a chunk of Brie, pickles, bread and butter and salad – enough for two to share), they cost £6 each and can be ordered from the school office by the end of Monday.
