Martello Rotary Club of Seaford Triple Challenge – the Martello Rotary Club of Seaford invites you to take part in the Triple Challenge to raise money for the British Heart Foundation. They are challenging people to run a trail half marathon, or walk the half marathon course or ride a circular 20 mile or 30 mile off-road cycle route. The event starts at the seafront in Seaford and then goes onto the Downs to the north of the town.
