Alfriston School Pupil Premium Report 2012-2013

Pupil Premium funding was introduced by the Government in order to address the attainment gap between vulnerable pupils and their peers.

The money is allocated to schools based on the numbers of pupils eligible for free school meals, are in care or have a parent serving in the Armed Forces. From 2012-13, this has been expanded to include all children who have been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

We have offered support in the following ways:-

- Additional individual teaching support
- Additional support from teaching assistant in the classroom
- One to one support from teaching assistant
- Subsidising residential trips for Year 2, 5 & 6
- Access to extra-curricular activities
- Swimming lessons

Summary of Progress

- Half of the children are achieving in line with or above national expectation. Of
 these a third made expected progress or better and are closing the gap. The
 remaining two thirds are achieving expected progress or better in two core
 subjects but did not achieve expected progress in the third.
- Half of the children are achieving below national expectations and have additional needs. Two thirds of these achieved expected progress or better and are closing the gap. The other one third of these achieved expected progress in one core subject but not in the other two.
- Pupils who were able to access residential trips and extra-curricular activities due to the funding showed increased confidence and self-esteem.
