Introduction about Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support particular groups of pupils who are known to be at risk of underachievement and close the attainment gap between them and their peers.

The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools for pupils, in Years R to 11, that are known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) or who have been eligible for FSM in the past six years.

Pupil Premium is also allocated for children who have been looked after by the local authority (CLA) continuously for more than six months. In East Sussex Pupil Premium for CLA is managed by the Virtual School for Children in Care.

The Pupil Premium was £623 per pupil in 2012/13 and £953 per pupil in 2013/14.

A premium is also paid for children whose parents are currently in the Armed Forces. In 2012/13 the premium was £250 and is £300 in 2013/4.

For the academic year 2013 -2014 we received £8577

How we spent the money last year

- Additional individual teaching support
- Additional support from teaching assistant in the classroom
- 1:1 support from TA
- Subsidising residential trips for Y2, 5 and 6
- Access to extra-curricular activities
- Swimming lessons

The impact of the spending on the pupils for whom pupil premium was paid

- 50% of children at the end of KS1 achieved their targets in reading, writing or maths
- 100% of children at the end KS2 achieved their targets in reading, writing or maths
- Pupils who were able to access residential trips and extra-curricular activities due to the funding showed increased confidence and self-esteem
