ESCC Survey

Absence

A reminder: when any child suffers from sickness and/or diarrhoea, they must be kept off school for 48 hours following the final episode. This is a County directive and is to try and reduce the spread of germs. For absences of a day or more please can a letter/email note explaining the absence be sent to the school office upon the child's return to school.

School Open Day

We held our open day yesterday, for prospective parents for September 2017 Reception Class intake. All of our visitors commented on how wonderful the Years 5 and 6 students were who gave them a tour of the school. Visitors said how the children were extremely positive about the school, informative, friendly and welcoming and we are very proud of them all.

Bad Weather Procedure

In the event of snow or flooding, the school will take a decision as early as possible about whether to open or not. Please be assured that the decision to close the school is never taken lightly, but is based on the health and safety of children, parents and staff travelling to and from the school, the ability to operate the school safely during the day and the conditions in Alfriston itself. If a decision is made to close the school, this is put on:

- local radio, Heart FM on 102.4-103.5FM and at http://www.heart.co.uk/sussex
- an Eschools email or text is sent out
- a notice on the school gate/door (only possible if a member of staff can get to the school).

If the decision is made to open the school, children should come to school equipped to play in the snow – good coats, wellies, hats, gloves and scarves. If the school is open, but your particular circumstances make it unsafe to travel to school, please let us know. In this case absence is authorised. Please make sure the school has up to date contact details including mobile phone numbers and if possible an alternative local contact. Hopefully we will not have to close the school at short notice.
