School Games Day

We are looking forward to our annual school games day next Wednesday, 28th June. If the weather is not looking good for this we will make a decision about whether it can go ahead as soon as possible. The reserve day is Thursday 29th. We hope to be ready to start the games day at 9.15am, we will give the children a break at 10.30am, and aim to finish the event at 12.30pm. The children will have lunch as usual (school lunch or packed lunch) and Alison in the kitchen has kindly organised a themed lunch - American Day. Instead of roast dinner, the menu offered on this day will be burgers or veggie hot dogs served with potato wedges, sweetcorn and coleslaw, along with the usual side salad. Jacket potatoes and baguettes will be offered as well. Dessert will be a choice of ice cream, fresh fruit or yogurt. If we have to postpone School Games Day due to poor weather, the American-themed menu will still be served on Wednesday and the regular menu will be offered on reserve School Games Day on the Thursday. The FoAS will be selling bacon rolls, teas and coffees on the day at the Pavilion on the Rec for parents to purchase throughout the morning, from school drop off time. Please note that these items will not be available to purchase for the children. The children will be sitting with the other members of their house teams under gazebos, supervised by staff, on one side of the running track and parents/carers will be seated on the opposite side. Please can we ask that parents/carers remain on their side of the track; children will not be allowed over to be with parents. This is for two reasons: it is unfair for children who do not have an adult come to support them at the event and it is very hard for staff to supervise the children when they are roaming around. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Please could children come into school on games day dressed in their PE kit (they may wear plimsolls or trainers) and wearing a t-shirt the colour of their house team, so they will need to take their PE kits home on Tuesday afternoon. Just as a reminder: Cuckmere is blue, Windover is green and Exceat is red. If your child/children do not have a relevant coloured t-shirt, please don't worry as we have coloured bibs they can wear. It is essential that all children bring a named water bottle and sunhat to school (and a jumper if the weather is a little chilly) and that they have had suncream applied before school.

Summer Fair

Parents, carers and friends are welcome to come back to school for the summer fair which will be taking place later on during the day after the school games day, from 2pm until 4pm. Children from Emerald Class have been busy organising this event alongside the FoAS. It will include lots of fun activities including tombolas and refreshments. We look forward to seeing you there.
