Clubs

We have a full programme of clubs on offer for this term – all of which were detailed in the letter sent home earlier this week. Please note that there are still spaces in all clubs if you would like to sign your child/children up for any. All clubs **must** be paid for in advance of the first club session starting. Wendy, our dance club teacher, has asked that the fees for her club are paid by cash or by bank transfer please and **not** by cheque. If anyone wants her bank details, she can supply them; please ask. Clubs need a minimum number of attendees to run, and some clubs have not yet reached this point. Please could you sign up your child/children for the clubs which take place before and after school by **9am tomorrow**, **Friday**, to enable decisions to be taken as to whether the club can commence next week. Thank you.

Medicines and Inhalers

Please can parents/carers return to school any medication and inhalers that need to be kept in school for their children. Please see the school office as new medication consent forms need to be completed for this year.

Lunch Boxes

As we start a new year I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers about lunch box content which forms part of our Healthy School Policy.

Foods to include:-

Below is a list of foods that **can** be included in packed lunches. This is based on information obtained from the Department of Education advice on food in schools, the Children's Food Trust and the NHS.

- Fruit and Vegetables at least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables.
- Protein meat, fish, egg or other source of non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, hummus or dhal).
- Oily Fish such as tinned or fresh mackerel, sardines, salmon, tuna.

- Carbohydrate starchy food such as bread, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes, chapattis and roti.
- Dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais, or calcium, fortified Soya products.
- Drinks water, milk or a small carton (no more than a 150ml portion size) of fruit juice is acceptable and should, where possible, be diluted with water. Smoothies are also acceptable as long as they are 100% pure fruit and have no added sugar.

Only ONE of these foods in packed lunches per day:-

• Small packet of crisps or a small cake (not chocolate) or a plain biscuit or a snack size portion of dried fruit.

Packed lunches must NOT include any of the following:-

- Fizzy/sugary drinks in cartons, bottles or cans (including squash, fruit shoots, diet or energy drinks which can contain high levels of caffeine and other additives which are not suitable for children)
- Confectionary such as sweets, marshmallows and candy
- Chocolate to any type including chocolate bars, chocolate cake, chocolate coated biscuits or items containing chocolate
- Chocolate spread as sandwich filling
- Nuts or nut products, including coconut

If a packed lunch contains an item that does not adhere to the 'content of packed lunches' above, we will take care to deal with the child sensitively, and will contact the parent to discuss the issue. If necessary items will be removed by staff and returned to the parent at the end of the day although we would always aim to resolve any issues by speaking to parents first.

Food safety

We have children in school with food allergies so do not allow nuts or nut products, including coconut. If children are bringing grapes to school either as a snack or in their packed lunch they must be cut length ways. If your child's lunchbox contains a sausage, this must also be cut length ways and then in to small sections. This is due to them being a potential choking hazard and follows safety guidelines. Packed lunches should be in a container where food items can be stored securely and appropriately until the lunchtime period. We recommend parents/carers to include an ice pack, to reduce the risk of harmful bacteria growing if left in warm temperatures.
