This Week's Class News

Pearl Class

This week Pearl class have been enjoying the story, 'Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave' by Quentin Blake. The children have written a sentence or story in response to the book, including finger spaces and great sounding out!

The class have been exploring floating and sinking, predicting and discovering which items float and sink! They have been comparing capacities of different bottles and learning to estimate how many cupfuls each bottle may hold. The also made a junk model boat for Breakspear, Mrs Armitage's dog! Our boat had to float, be strong and have two exciting features!

Lastly, the children have practised their activities for School Games Day and enjoyed a swimming lesson with Sally.

Ruby Class

In Ruby class this week, the children have started their seaside brochures. They have used lots of wonderful adjectives to persuade people to come to their favourite seaside town.

In maths, the children have been measuring and comparing the mass of different objects using balancing scales.

During geography, they have been learning about the countries that make up the UK and their capital cities.

Next week, the children will be looking at the results of their plants investigation in science and writing about what they found out.

Sapphire Class

In Sapphire class, the children have been learning how to solve problems involving money including converting from pounds to pence.

English lessons have been research based as the class have been compiling information about the life of William Shakespeare to record in a biography.

In PE, the class have continued their swimming lessons and have been practicing throwing javelins in athletics ready for our School Games!

Emerald Class

In maths, Emerald Class have continued their learning about the properties of shapes. This week, there has been a focus on drawing given angles and shapes.

In Science, they have looked at the ways that plants disperse their seeds and the reason that this is so important.

In English, the children started to look at The Smuggler's Song, a poem by Rudyard Kipling, which links well to the learning journey topic.
