Attendance

As per our most recent Ofsted report which stated 'leaders and those responsible for governance should ensure that all pupils have good, regular attendance', we will be publishing attendance and punctuality figures each week in the newsletter for each class as well as for the whole school. Each class will use a traffic light system for attendance where green is for 100% - 98%, yellow for 98% - 96% and red for less than 96%.

Unfortunately our attendance figures were affected last week by several children being unwell. Like much of the local community, we seem to have been hit by seasonal illnesses.

Puppet Theatre Project

Eleanor Conlon and Katie Sommers, from the puppet theatre company, are performing a 15 minute show, which they have created especially for the school, this Friday during celebration assembly to demonstrate the sort of thing that the children will be involved in. Parents are warmly invited to attend the assembly. All the children from the school will be involved in a whole school creative day on Tuesday 27th February and will contribute to the show. A letter will be sent out next week outlining the project and inviting the Years 5 and 6 pupils to sign up to the afterschool clubs.

Art Sessions

A letter was sent home at the start of this week to children in Emerald Class regarding art sessions for this term. Please can a reply slip be completed for every child and returned to the office by tomorrow.

Maths House Competition

Yesterday we held a maths competition for the whole school. Great teamwork was displayed by all the teams and lots of fun was had with the overall winner being Windover.

Clubs

A separate letter regarding the clubs for this term was sent home at the end of last week. Please complete the reply slip for your child/children if they wish to take part in any of the clubs (Lego Club is now full). Please note that a new reply slip is required for this term even if your child took part in the club last term.

Netball Tournament

The Alfriston All Stars will be taking part in a netball tournament later this term. A letter has been sent home to team members. Please can the reply slip be returned to the school office as soon as possible if your child/children would like to take part.

Cricket Competition

Later this term we will be taking a team of Years 5 and 6 children to compete in an indoor cricket competition, which is being organised and run by Sussex Cricket, against other local primary schools. The overall winner of the competition will then be invited to attend the County Finals. If your child has received a letter inviting them to play at this event, please return the reply slip to the school office as soon as possible.

Violin Lessons and Brass Lessons & Assembly

On Monday, 15th January, there will be a violin and brass assembly at 2.30pm, to which parents and carers are invited. The following week, on Monday 22nd January, Mrs Kearley will hold a meeting after school for parents who are interested in brass lessons for their child/children.

Census Day

Thursday 18th January is national School Census Day. The Government currently funds a universal infant free school meal for children in Key Stage 1 and the funding for these meals is based on the number of infant children who have a school meal on census day. The school only receives funding for the amount of free school meals actually eaten on census day. Consequently, if your child doesn't have a school meal on this day, but does on any other day within the school year, the school must fund the school meals from our teaching and curriculum budget. We are keen to avoid this especially at a time of challenging budgets. Therefore we would like to see as many children as possible from Pearl and Ruby Classes having a school meal on 18th January. To help with this, our meal provider, Chartwells, has decided to offer a special, popular menu to the children for lunch. The meal choice for Census Day is: fish fingers or bean and potato burrito, both served with chips, baked beans and garden peas or a jacket potato with a choice of fillings. Dessert options are soft cheese and biscuits, fresh fruit or yogurt. If your child doesn't usually have a school lunch on a Thursday, but would like to on the 18th, please advise the school office by 9am on Monday 15th January.

We are allowing children in Sapphire and Emerald Classes to have a school meal and enjoy this special menu as well if they would like. If they usually have a packed lunch, please send in £2.10 per meal to the school office in an envelope with your child's name by 9am on Monday 15th January. If your child usually has a school meal on Thursdays, then there is no need to do anything.

Please note that for Friday 19th January the meal choices have changed and they will be organic beef bolognaise or vegetable biryani, both served with sweetcorn and fresh broccoli as well as jacket potatoes with a choice of fillings. The dessert options will be carrot and pineapple cake, fresh fruit or yogurt.
