This Week's Class News

Pearl Class

This week, Pearl class have been learning about space! They have enjoyed finding out space facts using non fiction books and have written their own non fiction book. They made their own planets by rolling marbles in paint and used them to create swirls and whirls. The children then decorated their planets with collage materials to represent craters and rocks! They have enjoyed learning about 2 and 3 dimensional shapes and creating models and pictures of space rockets. The children have also been using the apparatus in PE to travel in lots of different ways, including bouncing like astronauts. We are looking forward to our 'Space Day' next week!

Ruby Class

In Ruby Class this week, the children have been exploring non fiction texts and preparing to write their own next week. In science, the children learnt about how different animals are adapted to their habitats. They focused on polar bears and will be using the information they found in their non fiction texts too. The children loved our 'Different Faiths' day on Wednesday. Ruby Class focused on the Hindu wedding ceremony. They loved dressing up in a traditional wedding outfit and dancing to Indian style music. The children have loved their yoga unit this term and have been incorporating many of their new positions into their daily morning stretch.

Sapphire Class

In Sapphire Class this week the children have been using the Greek Myth of 'Pandora's Box' as a stimulus for their English lessons and dance lesson. (This week they have had to grapple with some very complicated Ancient Greek names and it has not been at all easy getting the pronunciation correct!)

In maths the children have been continuing their work on multiplying a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number and are now trying to condense the steps necessary to get to the correct answer - it's been a tricky week!

Emerald Class

Emerald Class have been using their fraction knowledge and strategies to add, subtract and multiply! In English, the focus has been on creating suspense and tension by writing using the 5 senses. The class have enjoyed learning about the Ancient Greek Olympics in History as well as modern day power stations around the UK in English.
