# This Week's Class News

## **Pearl Class**

This week, Pearl class have been learning about beans! We have enjoyed listening to, and retelling, the story, 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Jack sent us some magic beans so we have planted them and hope that they grow into giant beanstalks! They have written instructions to tell the story character, Jasper, how to grow beans as he was a little confused! They have also been adding and taking away with beans!

On Thursday the class had a visit from the health team and learnt about how to be safe in the sun - slip, slop, slap, sunglasses, shade!!

We have continued to explore curling and stretching in gymnastics.

#### **Ruby Class**

In Ruby class this week, the children have been thinking of questions to ask the 'Bog Baby' from the new story they are reading.

In maths, the children have been exploring fractions of shapes and solving problems using their new learning.

In art, they began a new unit of work looking at the work of William Morris. The class also explored different ways to help the environment as part of 'Earth Day'.

#### **Sapphire Class**

In English, Sapphire class have been using sub-headings in their writing as they reviewed and compared two traditional European legends – The Glass Knight from England and The Shoemaker and the Dragon from Poland.

The fractions journey has continued this week with adding and subtracting 2 or more fractions with common denominators.

The class have also begun exploring stereotypes as part of the PSHE Relationship focus for this term, have been discussing technology and how it can be used to communicate and have begun learning about European countries as part of the Learning Journey for this term.

#### **Emerald Class**

Emerald have had a great first week back after the Easter break. They started their Science topic: Living Things and their Habitats, with a look around the school grounds at the microhabitats we have and the creatures that live in the vicinity. A slow worm and a newt were the highlights!

They have also been looking at statistics in Maths, reading information in line graphs and tables and considering the ways in which this information can be used.

They have looked at the way the point of view in a story affects how we view characters and are writing from different points of view.
