

## Mathematics

### Addition and subtraction

#### Year 1

- I can represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- I can add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including 0

### Measurement

#### Year 1

- I can tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

#### Year 2

- I can compare and sequence intervals of time
- I can tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.
- I know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day

### Fractions

#### Year 2

- I can recognise, find, name and write fractions  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- I can write simple fractions, for example  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

## Science

### Plants

- I can identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees
- I can identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees
- I can observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants
- I can find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.



## English

### Reading

- I can share and enjoy fiction and non-fiction books about the environment and growing.
- I can ask and answer questions about a text
- I can infer information about a character's feelings
- I can make predictions about what will happen next
- I can talk about words and phrases that I like

### Writing

- I can write for a range of different purposes
- I can use the phonics I have been taught in my reading and writing
- I can spell common exception words
- I can use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters
- I can use question marks and exclamation marks
- I can use conjunctions (and, because, but, so)
- I can use adjectives
- I can use commas in a list
- I can use apostrophes for contractions and singular possession
