## Census Day Menu

Thursday 20th January is national School Census Day. The Government currently funds a universal infant free school meal for children in Reception and Key Stage 1 and the funding for these meals is based on the number of infant children who have a school meal on census day. The school only receives funding for the amount of free school meals actually eaten on census day. Consequently, if your child doesn't have a school meal on this day, but does on any other day within the school year, the school must fund the school meals from our teaching and

curriculum budget. We are keen to avoid this especially at a time of challenging budgets. Therefore, we would like to see <u>as many children as possible from Pearl and Ruby Classes having a school meal on 20th January</u>.



To help with this, our meal provider, Chartwells, has decided to offer a special, popular menu to the children for lunch.

The meal choice for census day is: beef burger or veggie hotdog, both served with chips, sweetcorn and baked beans, or a jacket potato with a choice of fillings.

Dessert options are vanilla ice cream, fresh fruit or yogurt.

As chips are being offered, for this week only, we are swapping the Thursday and Friday lunches around. This means, the meal that would have been served on Thursday will be served on Friday instead. If you haven't booked a meal for your child on Thursday 20th January but they would now like it, please either book through Parentpay or advise the school office as soon as possible.

## **Covid-19 Update**

## The self-isolation advice for coronavirus (COVID-19) has changed

It is now possible to end self-isolation after 7 days, following 2 negative LFD tests taken 24 hours apart if you do not have a high temperature. The first LFD test should not be taken before the sixth day.

#### **Positive cases**

If your child has a positive lateral flow test but don't have coronavirus symptoms they <u>no longer</u> need to take a PCR test to confirm the result but should isolate in line with Government guidance.

## What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, please take a PCR test and if positive remain at home for at least 7 days from the date when symptoms appeared.

## **Staff Absence**

We will inevitably see a steady increase in Covid-related staff absence this January. All schools will be facing the same issues and this means it could be hard to find supply teachers due to a shortage in the area and high demand. The school must have enough staff to maintain a high standard in supervising all of our pupils. If your child is isolating and well enough for remote learning please access work which will be set on Google Classroom. Any issues with this, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.
