### Drop Off and Pick Up

We are constantly reviewing the practice that we have put in place to enable children to arrive and leave the school premises safely, this has resulted in some changes starting from today. We would like to thank you for working with us to enable this to happen. Below are some details to note:

1) The key to the smooth arrival and departure is turning up at the allotted time slot; the aim of this is prevent gatherings at the entrances;

2) From today, the 'no more than 6' rule will be in place issued by the Government; please, once you have left the school, do not meet in groups;

3) Any children that are late arriving or miss their slot please go in through the main school entrance;

4) Please try to keep your distance from others when walking to and from the school or waiting to drop off or collect your child.

#### Absence

Should your child be unwell and unable to attend school, please would you telephone the office before 9.15am to advise us of the reason for the absence. It is important that we are aware of the whereabouts of all children as soon as possible in a school day. Alternatively, you can email office@alfriston.e-sussex.sch.uk.

#### Online Safety

Please be aware of recommended ages for online games and social media sites. Content on these sites may be unsuitable for young children and we ask parents to help us safeguard your children so they are not exposed to inappropriate material.

Most sites, including TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram and Facebook, have a recommended age of 13+. Some such as Whatsapp are recommended for 16+ only.
