Parent, Carers & Visitors Code of Conduct

We would like to remind everyone of the **parents**, **carers** & **visitors code of conduct** which can be found in full on the school website - https://alfriston.eschools.co.uk/ website/school policies/54940.

We would like to draw particular attention to the following.

In order to support a peaceful and safe school environment the school will not tolerate parents, carers or visitors exhibiting the following:

- Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with any of the schools operation or activities.
- Using loud, abusive, threatening or offensive language or displaying temper.
- Threatening, in any way, a member of school staff, visitor, fellow parent/carer or pupil.
- Any inappropriate behaviour on the school premises.
- Sending abusive or threatening emails or text/voicemail/ phone messages or other written communications to anyone within the school community.
- Defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments regarding the school or any of the pupils/parent/staff, at the school verbally, on Facebook or other social sites.
- The use of physical or verbal aggression towards another adult or child. This includes physical punishment against your own child on school premises.
- Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of this child towards their own child. (Such an approach to a child may be seen to be an assault on that child and may have legal consequences).
- Approaching another parent to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of their child towards their own.

Should any of the above occur the school will take action by contacting the appropriate authorities and/ or sadly consider banning the offending adult/s from

This Week's Class News

Pearl Class

This week in Pearl class, they have started Phonics! They have learnt the sounds s, a, t and p. Well done to the children for practising these sounds in your sound book. The children have also been finding out about number 1! They have enjoyed lots of stories about families including 'So Much' and 'Five Minutes' Peace'. They have shared their family photos with their friends and made brilliant posters! They have continued to enjoy playing with their new friends, making models with the mobilo; creating family stories in the home corner and constructing the duplo train track. We look forward to seeing parents and carers at the Phonics meeting on Wednesday 2nd October.

Ruby Class

This week, Ruby class investigated waterproof materials and designed a coat for Wombat. They are looking forward to making their coats next week. In English, the children continued to explore the story 'Wombat goes Walkabout' and wrote their own play scripts for a section of the text. In maths, they have been focusing in on counting in, recognising and naming tens. In geography, they began to explore the names of the continents and found Australia on the map.

Sapphire Class

This week, Sapphire Class have produced their Harvest Festival Assembly. They recited a poem, taking parts and thinking about using expression, and some children were also eager to share some of their own writing, including poems and a prayer. Everyone spoke beautifully. In Maths, they are continuing to look at place value and patterns in number, counting in even steps and practising multiplication tables. They have located the continents on a map of the world using Atlases and have continued to enjoy their Tag Rugby sessions.

Emerald Class

Emerald class have been looking at rounding numbers in maths, using their place value knowledge. They have also been exploring patterns in number sequences including negative numbers. In English, the class were introduced to the class book – Spring Heeled Jack by Philip Pullman. This Victorian mystery adventure will be the basis for English lessons this term and has already inspired some great descriptive scenes.
