### **RSPB Garden Birdwatch**

Take part in the world's largest wildlife survey with the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch, 25th - 27th January. Just choose an hour any time over the three days and enjoy time with nature counting birds. Only count the birds that land in your garden or park, not those flying over.

The same birds may land more than once, so you can avoid double counting by recording the highest number of each bird species you see at any one time - not the total number you count over an hour. This will help the RSPB to understand the current situation with birds in the UK. See RSPB.org.uk.

### This Week's Class News

### **Pearl Class**

This week in Pearl Class, they have been enjoying the story, 'Naughty Bus'. Naughty Bus came to visit them but then he disappeared! They wrote some posters to ask people to find him. Luckily he came back to see them! They have also been learning to sing songs all about buses in music. In maths, they have learnt all about the number 12 and have been practising counting back in ones and finding the number that is 1 less than numbers to 20. They have also enjoyed making car track prints and mixing the colours as they whizzed through the paint. On Friday, they learnt about Chinese New Year and created their own dragon dance.

### **Ruby Class**

This week, Ruby Class have been exploring hot and cold areas of the world. They looked at how the temperature of a country is related to how close it is to the equator and enjoyed colouring in and labelling a world map to show their understanding. In English, the children received an exciting letter from Tofta (the main character in the 'Night Iceberg') and began writing their own letter back to her. During maths, year one have been problem solving using 'part, part, whole' and year two have been learning how to use the inverse to check their calculations. In art, the children experimented with a small piece of clay in preparation for making a clay polar bear next week. In computing, the children enjoyed using the camera to take pictures of plastic animals. They thought carefully about what makes a good photograph.

### Sapphire Class

In Sapphire Class this week they have been studying the Greek Myth of 'Theseus and the Minotaur' and using it as a stimulus for their English lessons as well as their dance lesson. In maths they have been continuing with multiplying 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers and this week they have been using place value counters and grids to ensure that they are multiplying and exchanging correctly with answers within the hundreds. The children are realising that if they focus on neat presentation it will aid accuracy. In Science they have been experimenting with magnets and exploring how they attract and repel.

### **Emerald Class**

Emerald Class have been working to become masters at adding fractions, using a range of strategies to represent the process. Chapter 2 of their quest stories is well under way, with a focus on adding dialogue using correct speech punctuation. In Geography, the class learned about what is needed to create a perfect site for settlement and designed their own ideal settle-site.
