### **Christmas Reading Update**

#### Village Roadworks

You may be aware that the village high street will be closed from January, for approximately 5 months, while South East Water carry out work. As the work progresses through the village they will be widening the exit to the free car park to allow for two way traffic. They have also been practising reading and writing words with three sounds during phonics. They have learnt all about the number 10 in maths and have been practising ordering numbers to 10. The children have also been playing games to help them learn 1 more than any number to 10. They enjoyed performing their Christmas play for children in the school and their grown ups - we hope you enjoyed it too!

# Ruby Class

This week, Ruby Class have loved performing their Christmas Nativity. They all worked so hard learning their lines and each of the wonderful songs. They also finished creating their Tudor houses this week. They look fantastic! In maths, the children have been exploring 'part, part, whole' and solving lots of different problems. Next week, the children will be doing some Christmas baking and developing their food preparation skills in DT.

# Sapphire

This week, Sapphire Class have reviewed the Science investigation that they had set up to find out about tooth decay, using eggs as they react in a similar way to tooth enamel. The results did surprise them a little, as they had thought that orange juice was a healthy option. However, they found that it decays teeth badly. When they discussed the results, they thought that it was probably because it is high in sugar. However, both the cola and the sugar-free cola were equally bad for teeth and they turned the eggs a nasty brown colour! They weren't surprised to find that the water had no real effect at all. They have also been reading the Christmas story: Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present, and writing their own sections to add to it. They are reviewing their writing and are proud of the progress that they have made. They also very much enjoyed the Nativity acted by the younger children.

#### **Emerald Class**

Emerald class have been learning how to use number facts to solve maths problems as elegantly and efficiently as possible. This week has also seen the first fraction lessons of the year. In English, the class have written persuasive letters to the (fictional) Victorian villain, Mack the Knife. As Christmas nears, there has been a lot of RE learning around the Christmas story, including preparation for next week's carol concert, and a specific focus on advent and Christingle.
