School Christmas Lunch

We will be having our school Christmas lunch on Thursday 14th December. As is our long tradition, we would like as many children as possible to have the cooked school meal on this day so that we can all enjoy the occasion together. The children will be served roast turkey, cocktail sausage wrapped in bacon, sage and onion stuffing, roast potatoes, peas and carrots topped off with gravy. Alternatively the vegetarian option of Quorn roast is available. The main meal will be followed by a Christmas shortbread biscuit and fresh fruit. The children are invited to bring in Christmas hats to wear during lunch. Parents of children who already have school meals on a Thursday will have the Christmas lunch included on their normal termly bill, if in Sapphire or Emerald Classes. For those who normally have a packed lunch, please send in the reply slip at the end of the newsletter along with payment of £2.10, in a clearly marked envelope, by Friday 1st December. All children in Pearl and Ruby Classes can have the lunch free of charge under the universal infant free school meal scheme. Please note that we will require a reply slip for every child, whether they normally have a school lunch or not, recording their meal choice so that Alison, our cook, knows quantities to order.

School Open Day

We held our open day yesterday, which was aimed at prospective parents for September 2018 Reception Class intake. It was a busy morning with our Year 5 and 6 students giving tours of the school to the visitors and a presentation to prospective parents from myself, with representatives from the governors and the FoAS also present. It was lovely to hear many comments from the visitors on the confidence, friendly nature, helpfulness and attitude of the children who acted as tour guides. Well done to everyone involved.

Trips

It's a busy time at the moment for school trips. On Monday Sapphire Class will be out on a trip and will require a packed lunch. Please refer to the letter sent home at the start of this term for full details. Last Friday Emerald Class visited Glyndebourne and watched the opera 'Belongings', an opera which linked to their topic this term, as it tracks the journey of two groups of young people, one a group of evacuees escaping the Blitz and the other a group of refugee children re-building their recently demolished shelter while contemplating the final dangerous stage of their journey. They had a fantastic time and really enjoyed the performance. Eliza, from Year 6, went to the Royal Albert Hall on Sunday with the East Sussex Music Service Choir and took part in a performance of 'Messiah'. She was one of 150 children who went along from East Sussex to come together with others from across to country to create a 1500 strong children's choir. Also on Sunday, we had twelve children representing the school at the village Remembrance Service at St Andrew's Church following the memorial parade. Most of our children who attended were very young and everyone's behaviour was impeccable. They represented themselves and the school very well, showing respect and courtesy. Isobel and Nicole, from Year 2, became the prayer readers at the last moment and were amazing at managing a difficult prayer, reading it with clarity and fluency. We had many compliments from the community, saying what a credit the children were to the school. Thank you to everyone who came along and well done. On Tuesday this week the Year 3 children went along to the church to Raise the Flag for Prince Charles' birthday. While there they read out some information about the Prince and the charitable work that he is involved in. This week we have sent home to children in Emerald and Sapphire Classes more letters regarding future trips, so please return the forms by the relevant dates.
