Pearl Class

Pearl Class have had their first full week at school! This week, they have been reading lots of rhyming stories and playing rhyming games. They have been practising counting things indoors and outdoors. They had their first P.E lesson and played circle games and running around games - they were brilliant at listening! The children have also enjoyed singing songs together, including pat-a-cake - a particular favourite! Well done for a fabulous first whole week at school!

Ruby Class

In Ruby Class this week, the children have been getting stuck into their 'Down Under' learning journey. They have explored a story about Australian animals and asked questions about what might happen next. In art, they have been looking at Aboriginal paintings and beginning to develop the skills to create their own. During PE, the children have been exploring the seasons through dance and developing their ball skills in PE. Next week, they are looking forward to beginning a science project based on the story they are reading in English.

Sapphire Class

It has been another busy week in Sapphire Class. They have made a great start in their Science, looking at the scientific vocabulary linked to their topic about animals including humans and beginning to find out about the types of nutrition that are needed by different creatures. In the playground, they investigated how compasses work, naming eight compass points. In English, they read an acrostic poem and looked at collective nouns for animals and birds. Next week it will be Harvest Festival and they have started to think about what they will be presenting in the assembly.

Emerald Class

In maths, Emerald class have been using their place value knowledge to order and compare increasingly complex numbers. English lessons have been used to continue to write and publish the first stories of the year, which can now be seen on display in the main corridor on Emerald's Wow Writing board. This week in art, Mrs. Hoye continued to explore William Morris and the class built their own printing blocks.
