Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Sapphire Class who have an exciting and action packed term to look forward to!

## **Curriculum Information**

### **Learning Journey topic**

This term, our topic will continue to be 'The Romans'. This is an historical topic with elements of art and design as we explore what life was like in Britain during the Roman Invasion, from daily life and routines to the homes that Romans in Britain would have lived in.

Our science topic will look at living things and their habitats. We will explore the variety of local and international habitats and understand how animals have adapted to be specially suited to survive in their habitats.

### **English**

In English this term, alongside our Learning Journey, we will be using the reading that we do to broaden our factual knowledge and lead into our writing, and we will think about ways to effectively plan written work across a variety of styles and genres. We will also have regular spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions.

We will continue with our focus on spelling, as this is an area that has been highlighted in the National Curriculum, and we will look at patterns and rules as well as encouraging children to learn the spelling of words that they use regularly to support their writing. Our testing will continue with progression earned once we can see that children have not just learned a correct spelling but are applying them consistently within their writing.

### **Maths**

Maths lessons will be taught within the class to enable us to effectively deliver the National Curriculum and we will initially be building on our understanding of the number system. We will also have a focus on mental mathematics, developing a range of strategies for calculating mentally, concentrating in particular on multiplication and division as well as applying our number skills to contexts including measurements. We will continue to look at the multiplication tables, and children will carry out a weekly 'Times Table Challenge', to increase their speed and recall of these number facts. Progression will be based on consistency and accuracy.

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## P.E.

Our PE sessions this term will focus on gymnastics and outdoor adventure activities. Our fixed PE slots are Monday for gymnastics and Wednesday for OAA, though these are subject to change. Please note that we ask that children bring in their PE kit every day to school; in this way we can be as flexible as possible in order to take advantage of any extra PE slots in the timetable.

## R.E.

Our RE topic this term is 'The Easter Story' and will include Sapphire Class leading our annual Easter Service. This will be largely taught during English lessons in a cross-curricular way so that children are still practising skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening while the RE provides the context. Parents and guardians should be aware, as detailed in government legislation, that they have "the right to request that the pupil be excused from all or part of the RE provided. They do not have to provide a reason and the school must comply with their request. It is however the parents' or guardians' responsibility to provide alternative work if the child is withdrawn. Parents and carers must also be aware that RE is cross-curricular and in primary schools it may be taught as part of another subject area for which there is no legal right to withdraw."

## Home Learning

Homework supports children's learning and consists of core tasks which are ongoing activities: regular reading with an adult which should be recorded in the Reading Record Book, discussing the content in increasing depth in order to further develop comprehension; Spellings – the children have an individual spelling list which is recorded in their yellow Spelling Logs and updated regularly; children are also encouraged to undertake weekly Maths activities, including the use of the 'ttRockStars' website in order to develop children's knowledge of number facts.

In line with our Home Learning Policy, there will also be a project that will be discussed with the children who will be encouraged to plan and complete tasks over the term. It will then be presented and evaluated in class. Children will have details of the task for this term and a planning and evaluation sheet. These projects support children's learning in several ways; they enable children to research and to work creatively to present their learning. They are also able to present their work to an audience in order to develop their confidence.

Please help us to encourage your child to complete their homework to the best of his or her ability and hand it in on time as this will support their learning and also develop their independence as they prepare for transition to secondary school. If you find that homework is a struggle for your child then please inform us immediately and together we will find ways of overcoming this.

## **Request**

We are always grateful for helpers to come in and listen to the children read or play maths games. If you feel you could spare an hour to do so and you have an up to date 'Alfriston School' Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, your help will be greatly appreciated. Please catch one of us in the playground, give us a call via the school office or arrange an appointment to see us. **We also have 3 trips out this term – Drusilla's, Fishbourne Roman Palace and our re-scheduled Wild Beach day. We would love to hear from volunteers for any of these trips. Please see the school calendar or contact the office for further details.**

If you have any questions or concerns, please do come and speak to us – it is important that children are happy at school in order to learn to the best of their abilities and we will always try to make time to talk to you.
